

# Summerhaven Wind Energy Centre - Community Liaison Committee (CLC)

Summerhaven Wind, LP ("Company"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of NextEra Energy Canada, ULC will be **forming a Community Liaison Committee ("CLC")** as a forum to exchange ideas, share information and provide regular updates as the Summerhaven Wind Energy Centre ("Facility") progresses through construction and the first year of operation.

The CLC, as described in Conditions # L1 –L10 of the Summerhaven Wind Renewable Energy Approval, is intended to facilitate two-way communications between the Company and members of the public on issues or concerns related to the construction, installation, use, operation, maintenance and retirement of the Facility. IBI Group has been retained to act as a coordinator and facilitator of the CLC meetings.

A range of stakeholders (e.g. persons residing within 1 km of the Facility, other area residents and landowners, members of the agricultural and business community, government agencies, local organizations, special interest groups, etc.) and members of First Nations and Métis communities are being sought to join the CLC. The CLC will be limited to 14 members, however all meetings will be open (for observation) to the general public.

CLC members will be responsible for attending four (4) meetings over a two-year period (i.e., two (2) meetings annually). The meetings will take place on a weekday evening and last approximately 2 hours. CLC members will be encouraged to help relay information to and from other members of the community.
